Mission Statement: The mission of the Bay Country Figure Skating Club is to provide a safe, family friendly environment for people of all ages, to reach their full ice skating potential; whether it is recreational or competitive, while building self esteem, good sportsmanship and lifetime of good friends.

- **Who are we?**

The Bay Country Figure Skating Club (BCFSC) is a United States Figure Skating (USFS) member club and organized in 1982 as a not-for-profit organization within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986. We are dedicated to educating and encouraging participation in recreational and amateur figure skating programs for all interested community members. Our 27 year history speaks volumes of our dedication and commitment to our club.

We are located in the Delaware State Fair Centre Ice Rink, located at 644 Fairground Road, Harrington, Delaware 19952. Although we have been actively involved in skating activities at the Centre since it's opening in September of 2002, the BCFSC club and members have participated in figure skating events throughout the Del-Mar-Va area before the Centre had opened.

- **Who can join?**

Anyone who loves figure skating. Memberships are available for Basic Skills members (levels 1-6), Basic 7, Basic 8, Freestyle and above skaters. We also have memberships available for Non-Skaters who love the sport of figure skating and parent of skaters. When you join our USFS club you will be eligible to compete in all USFS competitions and sanctioned events.

- **Why should I join?**

Skaters of all levels join a figure skating club for different reasons. In order to test your levels of skating or compete in USFS competitions you must have an active USFS membership, you can register with a club. Also in joining our club you be eligible to buy ice freestyle packages at a discount. Freestyle ice is a time for you to practice on a controlled skating environment. You will be able to perform your jumps and spins on these freestyle sessions and play your routine music. You will also meet other skaters , receive little or no cost registration for club events and help participate in club fundraisers.

BCFSC promotes:

- positive attitude and honest effort
- cooperation with and respect for coaches
- setting a positive example for others
- treating others as you would like to be treated
- setting personal improvement goals for your skating

- **How do I join?**

For the 2010-2011 skating season membership and freestyle/ice package fees will be separate. As a member you will choose the membership that is right for you and the ice package that is suitable for you. If you do not want to choose an ice package members will receive a walk-on fee at a discounted rate. Fill out the enclosed membership package and return to the current Membership Chair. If you have any questions, the Membership Chair will be able to help you.

Full Skating Membership:

Skaters must have reached Basic Skills 7 or above. Membership includes registration as a USFS member, testing privileges at our home rink, discounted ice packages and voting privileges if 18 or older (under 18 parent/guardian will vote).

Cost: \$80.00/ season

Family Membership

Same as above must pay full price for first member.

Second Member \$ 60.00/season

Subsequent Members \$ 50.00/each person

Great news, for the 2010 season USFS is giving a \$20.00 discount for any new USFS

membership. Discount only for skaters who have never been registered with the USFS before, see application for discount. Not valid on family membership.

**** Any parent/adult wishing to run as a board/chair position must have current USFS membership.**

Associate Membership:

Skaters must have reached Basic Skills 7 or above. Membership includes testing privileges at our rink, discounted ice packages and voting privileges if 18 or older (under 18 parent/guardian will vote).

Our club must be skater's second USFS club and USFS dues must have been paid by home club.

Cost: \$55.00/season

Professional Membership: see coaches contract.

Social Membership:

Skaters must be Tot to Basic Skill 6, no higher. Membership includes basic skill registration with USFS, discounted ice packages and voting privileges if 18 or older (under 18 parent/guardian will vote).

Cost: \$35.00/season

Introductory Membership:

This membership is for anyone that has not had a current membership with the club, but is interested in advancing their skating potential. Membership includes 11 (45minute) club freestyle sessions. Freestyle times are for private coach instruction or practicing your skating elements with intermediate/advanced skaters. This is a onetime per season offer.

Cost: \$120.00/season

• Ice Time, Packages, & Cost...

Since our volunteers worked so hard for the 2009-2010 season we are able to offer reasonable ice fees for the 2010-2011 season. BSFSC is offering freestyle sessions on Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday this season. Session will be offered in either 1 daily session of 45 minutes in duration or 2 daily sessions in 90 minute durations. Double daily sessions have to be used same day they cannot be split during the week.

The Schedule for Club Ice Freestyle Sessions from 9-10-10 thru 6-11-11 is as follows:

Monday 5:20pm-6:05pm and 6:05pm-6:50pm

Wednesday 7:25pm-8:05pm and 8:05pm-8:55pm

Friday 5:20pm-6:05pm and 6:05-6:50pm

Saturday 9:10am-9:55am and 9:55am-10:40am

Ice Packages for 2010-2011 Seasons are as follows:

❖ Package 4a: 4 days a week 1 daily session (144 sessions) \$1008.00

❖ Package 4b: 4 days a week 2 daily sessions (288 sessions) \$1865.00

❖ Package 3a: 3 days a week at 1 daily session (108 sessions) \$804.00

❖ Package 3b: 3 days a week at 2 daily sessions (216 sessions) \$1507.00

❖ Package 2a: 2 days a week at 1 daily session (77 sessions) \$656.00

- ❖ Package 2b: 2 days a week at 2 daily sessions (154 sessions) \$1236.00
- ❖ Package 1a: 1 day a week at 1 daily session (38) sessions \$353.00
- ❖ Package 1b: 1 day a week at 2 daily sessions (76 sessions) \$680.00

Prices are based on the maximum number of sessions allowed on the 2010-2011 calendar. If there is a week with one freestyle, it was counted in the number of freestyles offered for the season. Sessions will be counted by the Treasurer and discussed with each member if there is a problem, especially if the rink is closed for state of emergencies, etc...

Walk-on Fees One session= 45 minutes

To avoid confusion skaters must skate within the 45 minutes they sign in for. If you arrive late you must pay for that session in full if you wish to skate on it.

- ❖ Member walk on is \$10.00 for one session.
- ❖ Learn to Skate walk on \$11.00 for one session.
- ❖ Non club/rink Skater walk on \$13.00 for one session.

Please note coaches are allowed to take BCFSC members on public sessions if you are at a lower skating level. Coaching can only be done in the center of the ice for moves only. You will not be able to play music on a public session. Public sessions are NOT INCLUDED in your ice packages.

● **Payments**

- There will be a 5% discount on ice packages paid in full by 9/18/10. There will be a 5% discount for 2nd, 3rd or more family member packages (excludes membership fees and first family member, highest package excluded from discount)
- Payment packages will be as follows Fall Session (9/10/10-12/22/10) due on 9/10/10, Winter Session (1/2/10-4/2/10) due on 12/22/10 and Spring Session (4/11/11-6/11/11) due on 3/28/10. There will be a \$50.00 penalty on quarterly payments made after the due dates.
- NO ONE WILL BE ALLOWED TO SKATE IF THEIR ICE BILL IS UNPAID.
- A return check fee of \$35.00 will be assessed for insufficient funds.

● **BCFSC Junior Board ...**

Bay Country Figure Skating Club started a Junior Board in 2006. The Junior Board helps involve all interested members under the age of 18 years of age. The Junior Board has an adult advisor and provides opportunities to develop our junior member's organizational and leadership skills. Typically, the Junior Board will tackle one or two key events during the year-planning, developing and implementing these projects from start to finish. Any junior member can join!

● **Parents, What is expected from you....**

Parents are very important to the club your participation and input during the season will help us grow for the future.

Parents please read all of the below requirements, your signature on the membership application will acknowledge that you are aware your requirements. We also ask that you read the skaters code of conduct and discuss with your skater as well.

MEETINGS:

In order for you or your skater to remain in good standing with the club each parent/adult skater must attend 2 general membership meetings and 4 monthly board meetings during the skating season for a full membership. For Social memberships you are required to attend 1 general membership meeting and 2 monthly board memberships a season. If you have a family membership with both full and social memberships you will only have to fulfill the full membership requirement. Associate members are encouraged to come to the board meetings, however it is not a requirement this season.

● **Fundraising...**

Volunteer hours are required for all membership levels, except Introductory and Coach, without volunteers we would not be able to offer reasonable ice packages. Each member (if over 18) or parent (if under 18) is responsible to give at **least 10**

hours of volunteer time to the club. This would be working at the bake sales during shows or competitions, raffle booths or helping at any special event for the club. *If you cannot give 10 hours of volunteer time within the year any member/parent would be responsible for a \$100.00 fundraiser charge due at registration to cover your volunteer time. Donations of food or goods to be sold during fundraisers do not apply to your hours worked.* All Associate/Social Members are responsible to give at least **5 hours** of volunteer time within the year. *If you cannot give 5 hours of volunteer time within the year any associate member/parent would be responsible for a \$50.00 fundraiser charge due at registration to cover your volunteer time. Donations of food to be sold during fundraisers do not apply to your hours worked.*

Volunteer time, donations and participation is important to our club since we are a not-for-profit organization, majority of the clubs income comes from our fundraising efforts.

- **BCFSC rink guidelines for parents**

1. Parents will not be allowed on the ice with shoes.
2. We ask that you refrain from standing in the ice door entrance or sit in the penalty boxes as this is distracting to all skaters and coaches.
3. Please remember to pay your coaches for lessons, unpaid coach fees will be notified to the club and will be a violation of your membership.
4. Everyone must abide by the rules given to us from the Centre Ice Rink management. Any concerns may be brought to the board's attention or the ice rink manager.
5. Please be honest about paying for freestyle sessions. Please remember to sign in your skater, repeated offenses of skating without paying will result in a termination of the skaters membership.
6. Please visit the website and bulletin board often for updated club information. Also make sure we have your email address on file, as email is our first way of notification.

- **U.S. Figure Skating Parents Code of Conduct**

Code of Conduct gives everyone a guide to what is expected of us if we are part of an organization, participating in a sport or as spectators at our child's events.

Preamble: The essential elements of character-building and ethics in sports are embodied in the concept of sportsmanship and six core principles: respect, responsibility, fairness, caring, trustworthiness and good citizenship. The highest potential of sports is achieved when competition reflects these "six pillars of character" (Arizona Sports Summit Accord)

1. I will encourage good sportsmanship by demonstrating positive support for all skaters, coaches and officials at every practice session, competition, ice show and test session.
2. I will place the emotional and physical well being of my child ahead of my personal desire to win.
3. I will encourage my child to skate in a safe and healthy environment.
4. I will inform my child's coach of any physical disability or ailment that may affect the safety of my child or the safety of others.
5. I will teach my child the doing one's best is more important than winning, so that my child will never feel defeated by the results of a competitive event.
6. I will never ridicule or yell at my child or other participant for making a mistake or blame my child's teammates for placement in a competition.
7. I will do my best to make skating fun and will remember that my child participates in sports for his/her own enjoyment and satisfaction not mine.
8. I will ask my child to treat other skaters, coaches, fans and officials with respect, regardless of race, creed, color, sexual orientation or ability.
9. I will applaud a good effort in both victory and defeat emphasizing the positive accomplishments and learning from the mistakes.
10. I will teach my child to resolve conflicts without resorting to hostility or violence.
11. I will be a positive role model for my child and other skaters.
12. I will demand a figure skating environment for my child that is free of drug or alcohol abuse and agree that I will not use or provide to a third party and drug proscribed by applicable federal, state or municipal law.

13. I will not assist or condone and competing athlete's use of a drug banned by the International Olympic Committee, International Skating Union, United States Olympic Committee or U.S. Figure Skating in case of athletes, to use such drugs or refuse to submit to properly conducted drug tests administered by one of these organizations.
14. I will not provide alcohol to, or condone the use of alcohol by minors, abuse alcohol in the presence of athlete members, or at U.S. Figure Skating activities or, in the case of athletes, consume alcoholic beverages while a minor.
15. I will encourage my child's coach to continue their education and training through programs offered by U.S. Figure Skating, the Professional Skaters Association and other accredited organizations.
16. I will respect my child's coach and refrain from coaching my child or other skaters during competitions and practices because it may conflict with the coach's plan or strategy.
17. I will respect the decisions of officials and their authority during competitions and test sessions and teach my child to do likewise.
18. I will show appreciation and recognize the importance of volunteers and club officials.
19. I will study the rules of the U.S. Figure Skating and teach my child accordingly so that we have an understanding and appreciation of the rules of competition and membership.
20. I will support all opponents in my child's competition and respect the rights of all skaters to participate.

I also agree that if I fail to abide by the aforementioned rules and guidelines, I will be subject to disciplinary action that could include, but is not limited to the following:

1. Verbal warning
2. Written warning
3. Parental suspension with written documentation of incident kept on file by BCFSC

● **Skaters What is expected of you at all times?**

BCFSC requires members to show sportsmanship, respect, dignity and courtesy at all practices, testing session and competitions. Through responsible behavior and behavior and fair play, skaters and their parents will assume the role of goodwill ambassadors of figure skating. Skaters please read all of the below requirements, your signature on the membership application will acknowledge that you are aware your requirements.

1. Keep your head up and be aware of other skaters around you when skating.
2. When not skating, leave the ice.
3. Do not stand around in groups and talk, you will be asked to leave the ice by you coach or the music supervisor if you do.
4. If you fall, get up right away. If you are hurt, stay still on the ice until a coach reaches you.
5. Do not stay in one place on the ice- stay moving.
6. Be on time for your session, especially after a resurface and use every minute of your ice time to the maximum.
7. Be kind to one another both on and off the ice. Please no arguments.
8. Say, "excuse me", if you can see that another skater does not see you coming.
9. Say, "I'm sorry" when you accidentally get in someone else's way, especially if they had the right of way. (it does happen sometimes)
10. When the freestyle session has completed please exit the ice immediately, the club will be charged an overage fee for skaters who do not exit at the end of the session.
11. Do not go onto the ice surface with shoes.
12. Before the start of a session **DO NOT** go out onto the ice until the zamboni doors have closed or the club will be fined.
13. Please abide by the rules of the management of the Centre Ice rink.

Disciplinary:

The following is a list of the offenses that will result in disciplinary actions:

- Dishonesty, theft, cheating, poor sportsmanship, criminal behavior or attempt to take unfair advantage of another in any activity.
- Use of vile, intemperate or abusive language
- Threatening or intimidating behavior
- Physical assault of any person
- Any act of harassment based on gender, ancestry, origin or race

- Immoral or indecent conduct
- Willful damage or destruction of facility equipment or property
- Possession, consumption or being under influence of any illegal drugs, alcohol or tobacco. (immediate removal from the ice/facility)
- Minors in possession/distribution or under influence of alcohol , tobacco or any illegal substances(immediate removal from ice/facility)
- Any disruption of its functions or its members which in fringes upon rights and well-being of others, including the interruption of coaches during lessons
- Ice kicking or excessive waste of ice time
- Not following rules and regulations of the ice rink.
- BCFSC can immediately dismiss skaters from the membership for certain offenses and will require full payment from the skater and/or parent or guardian for damaged property. BCFSC expects all skaters to abide by local, state and federal laws.
- BCFSC reserves the right to ask any skater to leave the ice for inappropriate conduct as stated above.

Disciplinary Actions to be taken:

First offense- verbal warning

Second offense- written warning

Third offense- Club skating privileges revoked (non skating members can have membership revoked)

Reporting of any incident (grievance) must be submitted to any BCFSC Board Member in writing and signed within reasonable time of incident.

● **USFS Skater's Code of Conduct**

USFS Code of Conduct (GR 1.03 and 1.04) as found in the USFS Skating Handbook

The following code of conduct applies to all participants in all competitions, exhibitions and training camps hosted, supported or sponsored by the USFS.

- I will recognize that my participation in all competitions, exhibitions and training camps hosted, supported or sponsored by USFS is an honor and a privilege that carries certain responsibilities. I agree to fully abide by the rules and guidelines set forth by USFS or its property designated agents. As a precondition to participation in USFS hosted, supported or sponsored events, I will adhere to the following tenets in good faith.
- I will exhibit the highest standards of fairness, ethical behavior and genuine good sportsmanship in all of my relations with others.
- I will not damage public or private property. I understand that I may be held financially responsible for damage deemed to be wantonly or willfully executed on my part, and that I may be subject to disciplinary action by the USFS.
- I will not use or possess illegal drugs and I will not engage in criminal penalties as well as penalties imposed by the USFS.
- I will adhere to the rules of the USFS and the host organization at all USFS hosted, sponsored, or supported training camps, competitions and exhibitions.
- I will conduct myself in a manner not detrimental to the welfare of figure skating. I understand that my actions reflect on the USFS and the sport of figure skating both positively and negatively. I understand that if my acts, statements or conduct are considered detrimental to the welfare of figure skating by the appropriate authority, I may be subject to penalties imposed by USFS pursuant to **GR 1.021**.
- I understand that the penalties that may be imposed may include, but are not limited to, loss of future international selections, loss of financial support from the USFS and Memorial Fund and loss of participation in USFS sponsored events.
- I understand that all disciplinary proceedings will be conducted pursuant to Article XXVII, Section 3, of the USFS Bylaws and that my rights and remedies are derived there from.

GR1.04The USFS will not tolerate or condone any form of harassment or abuse of any of its members including coaches, officials, directors, employees, parents, athletes and volunteers-or any other persons –while they are participating in or preparing for a figure skating activity or event conducted under the auspices of the USFS. The USFS Policy Statement on Harassment and Abuse may be found in its entirety online at www.usfigureskating.org. If any form of child abuse is observed or suspected, the observer should immediately contact either local law enforcement or a public child welfare agency and make a report. Any persons who violates this rule, who fails to appropriately report or who makes a false report or otherwise violates USFS's policies on harassment and abuse will be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with Article XXVII, Section 3 of the USFS Bylaws.

- **BCFSC Ice Etiquette Guide**

- **On Ice**

- Right-of-way is to be given to the skater whose program is being played, the dance pattern music being played and/or the skater who is having a lesson.
- There is to be no standing in groups chatting on the ice. Please leave the ice if you want to talk.
- Unless there is prior approval or special permission, dance sessions are generally reserved for dance and freestyle sessions for freestyle/free dance/moves.
- No gum chewing, eating or drinking is allowed on the ice. Only water bottles may be taken onto the ice.
- If you fall, get up immediately. If you are injured and cannot get up, do not move until the supervisor or a coach reaches you.
- Ipods/Mp3 players are allowed on the ice ONLY with prior approval of Skating Director. Please ask prior to skating session, not during- not interrupting lessons. Only one earphone should be in when skating and music played low as to hear other skaters as they are approaching if in a lesson.
- No swearing or bad language will be tolerated whether on or off the ice.
- Being disrespectful to coaches will not be tolerated.
- Please show courtesy to skaters, coaches, the music supervisor and parents at all times.
- Do not interrupt other skaters' lessons

- **Right of Way**

- 1) A **skater whose program is being played has the right of way**. Listen to the announcer announcing whose program is being played. If you are not familiar with the name, ask someone (your coach, another skater or the music supervisor). Yield the right of way to the skater that is practicing/performing their program.
- 2) A **skater in a lesson** has the right of way. Be aware, pay attention and yield the right of way to all skaters that are in lessons.
- 3) A **skater doing a dance to the music being played** has the right of way. Be aware of the dance that is being played and yield the right of way to all skaters doing the dance.

- **Flow of the Ice**

- 1) Spins should be done in the center of the ice.
- 2) Whenever possible, use the ends of the arena for jumping. Generally, this will be considered the jump zone.
- 3) Stay moving- standing means someone has to maneuver around you, which can cause an accident.

Thank you for skating with us. Any questions please feel free to contact anyone on the board for additional information. Any changes in the contracts will be determined by your elected board for the season and members will be notified.

USFS registration will not be processed without full payment for membership. Membership fees will not be refunded for any reason. If there are any unpaid fees by the end of the current skating season member will be notified to USFS as a member not in good standing with the club.

If you wish to renew your membership over the summer, only the membership portion must be filled out and returned at this time to the membership chair, before 7/1/10. Ice Package can be filled out start of skating season.
